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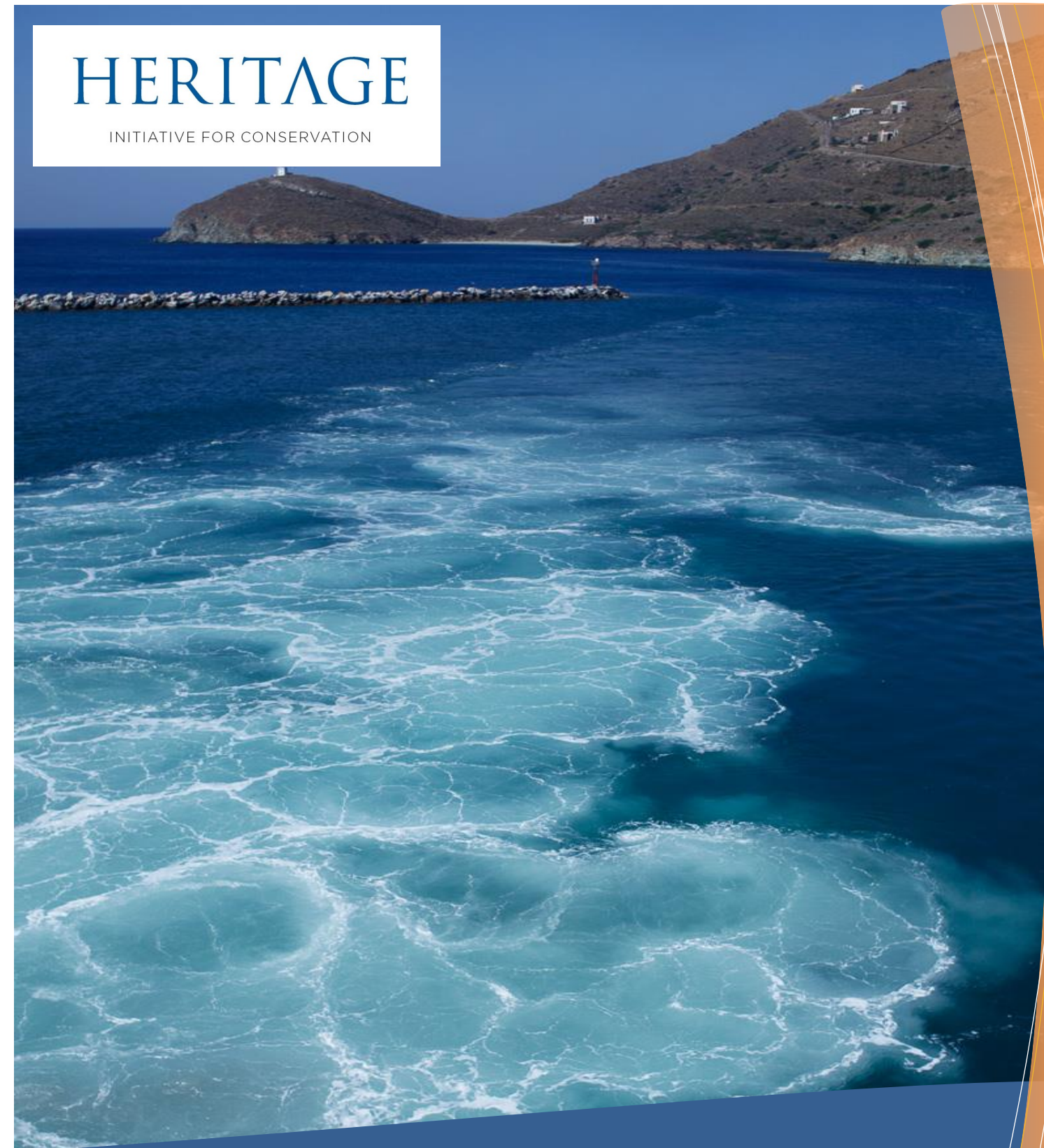

### Digital Tools for Heritage Management: 3D Laser

#### Scanning and Photogrammetry

29 may – 24 june

The digitization field school introduces students to a broad range of 3D recording and mapping techniques. Students are provided with hands-on instruction in these methods on site in the historical structures of Nafplion. Students record the town's extensive architectural remains using terrestrial laser scanning, GIS and GPS. The skills learned should allow students to work in digitization of any other site thereafter.

### Engaging local communities in heritage asset management through Archaeological Ethnography

26 june – 22 july

Our Archaeological Ethnography field school, aims to closely investigate the involvement of locals with their material and intangible heritage in general, and the remains of various heritage sites scattered around the area of our lab-area, Gonia, Crete. We address the issues arising in the documentation, preservation, and dissemination of cultural heritage through our research and our public engagement with the village of Gonia, as well as local and national stakeholders. Our goal is to develop a public archaeology program that will contribute to the sustainable development of the area, engage with the locals and render them more active in the protection of their own heritage.

How does heritage communicate? What messages does the heritage profession create about its sites, monuments and artefacts? Heritage is an active force in society and its use and adaptation is dynamic, changing and inconsistent. This course critically examines approaches to interpretation and communication of the past by exploring theories and practices of heritage communication for multiple audiences and purposes. A key focus will be on interpretation and communication of heritage and conservation, and a consideration of the complexity of multiple values, perspectives and voices within the construction of heritage on all levels, from the personal to the international.
